



Pantera FAQ #4 – Pep Rallies

1. Do parents really go to Pep Rallies?

Yes, they really do. The principal prefers that we sit at the top and really close together because these pep rallies are really for the students.

2. If the pep rallies are really for the students, why do parents go?

I go because the Panteras perform dances at the Pep Rally that they usually don't perform anywhere else. So, it's my only chance to see that dance.

3. What time is the pep rally and how long does it last?

The pep rallies are held on Friday mornings as determined by the principal. They start at 8:30 a.m. and usually end around 9:30. If you can't come due to work, the Panteras practice beforehand and you can videotape and see them at that time. If you do go early, please do not expect to visit with your daughter or wave at her or wink at her. She's at practice and needs to focus on Woody. The girls get to practice at 7:15 and head straight to the Main gym for practice. Parking is better at this time and so is seating. Oh, Woody said that after practice and before the pep rally starts, you are welcome to come down and get close up shots.

4. Can I leave after my daughter performs?

Yes, you can leave. However, plan ahead for that. It gets very crowded and kids sit on the steps so it's difficult to leave during the pep rally.

5. What happens at the Pep Rally?

Announcements, cheers, Pep Boys skit, our girls perform (usually early in the rally). There is a JV Pep Rally where the Pantherettes perform. There is also a Sr. Pep Rally where our Sr. Panteras perform. The football coach speaks as well as some players.
